

COVID-19 Safety Guidelines

CLOSE CONTACT Exposure		
<p>“Close contact” as defined by the CDC occurs when an individual is within 6 feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes starting from 2 days (or 48 hours) before the infected person’s onset of symptoms.</p>		
	With Symptoms	With No Symptoms
Close Contact & Vaccinated	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Required to stay home ● Get tested 3 - 5 days after exposure ● Safe to come back to church 10 days after exposure OR 8 days from exposure, with a negative test and no symptoms 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Monitor for symptoms and if symptoms develop, stay home ● Get tested 3 - 5 days after exposure
Close Contact & Unvaccinated	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Required to stay home ● Get tested ● Safe to come back to church 8 days from exposure, with a Negative test and no symptoms 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Required to stay home ● Monitor for symptoms ● Get tested 3 - 5 days after exposure ● Safe to come back to church 10 days after exposure OR 8 days from exposure, with a negative test and no symptoms
<p>Exception: In the PK–12 indoor classroom setting, the close contact definition excludes children who were within 3 to 6 feet of an infected children if both the infected children and the exposed children(s) correctly and consistently wore well-fitting masks the entire time.</p> <p>This exception does not apply to teachers, staff, or other adults in the indoor classroom setting.</p>

Positive COVID-19 Case Vaccinated & Unvaccinated	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● We require that you stay home for 10 days ● Safe to come back to Church 10 days after your symptoms developed 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● We require that you stay home ● Monitor for symptoms ● Safe to come back to church 10 days after positive test (As long as no symptoms develop)
